Rushmore, of the Manual Training High School; James Sullivan, Principal of the Boys High School; James F. Wilson, of the Stuyvesant High School; and Clarence D. Kingsley, of the Manual Training High School, Chairman. This committee made a detailed study of the entrance requirements of a large number of colleges and drew up a statement setting forth...

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
